Jessica Eves, a San Diego TK-6th grade teacher was named California Foundation for Agriculture in the Classroom Outstanding Educator of the Year at the 106th California Farm Bureau Federation Annual Meeting in Monterey, CA.

Eves classroom, which is part garden and part kitchen, teaches students to grow and nurture plants and then bring those crops into the cooking classroom to prepare simple recipes.

"When students understand agriculture, it influences how they eat. It helps them understand how much goes into making their food, inspiring them to want to make good food choices," Eves said.

Eves also runs a Junior Master Gardener program that teaches students agricultural concepts, including fertilizing, irrigation, and propagation, ultimately selling their seedlings at a local farmers market. <u>Watch Eves story here.</u>
