For the past 20 years, Jeff has used the contest to introduce his Los Angeles County students to agriculture. This past year, his student, Chloe Um won the state award for her story, *Healing Kiwifruit*.

Why do you believe it is important to teach agriculture?

My students learn about the history of farming in our local community and the rich heritage we owe to the farming industry in our region and the state. Our city, San Dimas, was founded by farmers and ranchers. Although farming has moved out of our region over the years, it is important to know our past. We also need to know that California, as a state, produces an abundance of agricultural products, which provide a healthy economy and elevated standard of living.

What is your favorite memory from participating in the *Imagine this...* Story Writing Contest?

My favorite memory is how special everyone in Agriculture in the Classroom made my student feel by setting up a book signing event and on-camera interview. To see my student smiling with happiness from her success as she met so many wonderful people, toured the Capitol, and received her awards was truly an unforgettable experience


2. Look at Agriculture... Organically! Now Accepting Grant Applications.








6. NEW - *What's Growin' On?*: Celebrating California's Top Ten
