How long have you been teaching students about agriculture?

I have been teaching fourth grade for the last 15+ years. Agriculture and water usage have been an important part of the fourth grade social studies focus on California. I am lucky to be living and teaching in Davis, a city that was built on a university that was founded in agricultural studies. Agriculture plays such an important role in many of my students lives, directly and indirectly.



What is your favorite AITC program/resource/event and why?

The What's Growin' On? newspaper is a wonderful resource, full of up-todate facts and information. It offers such interesting presentations and a wide variety of learning options covering all aspects of the agricultural industry in California.

Describe any agriculture-based projects you have been involved in lately.

Each year we teach units on the bounty of crops that are produced in California. We learn about produce and livestock and work in cooperative groups to create board games to use as study pieces and learning tools. We incorporate fruits and vegetables into perspective and vanishing point lessons as the kids create "Crate Label" artwork that is amazing. We


also examine the importance of agriculture to the Native Californian experience and highlight the different regions and the effect of geographic features and climate on the agricultural success of these first Californians. Throughout the year our class also has numerous culinary experiences that enable kids to cook and sample the wide variety of produce that we grow right here in their home state.

Do you have any advice for other teachers on implementing agriculture into the classroom?

Take advantage of all that our home state has to offer in the agricultural sense. If cooking in your class is not a realistic option, find a sampling/tasting lesson. Nowadays, there are so many easy lessons that follow food from farm to fork that will amaze your kids. Using the wide variety of data, graphs, and information from the agriculture world is an easy way to incorporate science and mathematics skills/practice in your classroom.
