

What is your favorite AITC program/resource/event and why?

I love so many of the programs. I really enjoy the Ag in the Classroom Conference. Having the opportunity to connect with others who have been using their garden as part of their curriculum was very inspiring. I was fortunate

enough to be chosen as a stop on this year's Seed Survivor Tour. Both the kids and I enjoyed all the interactive activities and lessons both in and out of the trailer. All these experiences helped me see that agriculture in the classroom could be expanded to be so much more. Previously, I had only been using our school garden as a reward for students, or an extra curricular break from daily lessons. After conference, and being so inspired, I am now beginning to tie it into the subject matters that I teach, math



and science. Providing the students with opportunities to learn about nutrition and cooking is a great new addition and joy to my classroom.

Describe any agriculture-based projects you have been involved in lately.

This past fall our pineapple guava trees went crazy. The students completed a research program on what we could do with them... so we made jam! I had them research some recipes, I brought in my blender and instant pot and taught them the process of preserving foods. We tried three different recipes and gifted them to people around campus. At the time we didn't have enough jars so we froze the rest and are now preparing to open shop again to provide Valentine's Day gifts for students' families.

Do you have any advice for other teachers about implementing agriculture into the classroom?

Jump in with both feet and just do it. There are so many things that can get in the way or excuses we make as to why we shouldn't start yet. We need irrigation, we need money, we need, need, need... Reality is you only need a pack of seeds. The kids love learning how to grow their own food and there is so much to be taught and learned throughout the growing process. I am so lucky that I am able to learn from my students about their established gardening knowledge and their personal endeavors of becoming future agriculturists. I look forward to continuing this adventure with my students as we all learn about ag!


