## Stacey Gonsalves Grades taught: 3rd School: Hart-Ransom Elementary School County: Stanislaus County

### How and when did you first learn about Ag in the Classroom?

I first learned about Ag in the Classroom about 10 years ago. I contacted a few of



our friends who are highly involved in California agriculture and they told me about Ag in the Classroom. My husband comes from an ag family and I wanted to find ways to teach my students about where their food comes from.

#### How long have you been teaching students about agriculture?

For 15 years! I started teaching about ranches and dairy farming. My husband would volunteer to do presentations for my grade level on cowboys and ranching lifestyle. We always dressed one of my students up as a cowboy. Even to this day, my former students would tell me that learning about agriculture was what they remembered the most about my class.

### What is your favorite AITC program/resource/event and why?

The *Imagine this...* story writing contest. I love this program because it allows students to choose a topic related to agriculture, research it, then develop their writing skills through stories.

#### Describe an agriculture-based project you have been involved in lately.

Due to COVID, ag based projects have been kept to a minimum. My class did, however, continue to participate in the *Imagine this...* contest. On a typical year, my class would participate in "AG Day" at our school where different members from our community would set up booths and activities for a day filled with learning about agriculture. My class also participated in the Stanislaus County Fair classroom projects where we would learn and build a "featured" animal to be displayed at the fair.

# Do you have any advice for other teachers on how to implement agriculture into their classrooms?

Reach reach out to community and state organizations who are ag related. Many organizations have teaching materials that are free to schools. The students love learning about agriculture! The easiest project to do is to plant a seed and watch it grow. You will be amazed at how excited the students become. It is so important that we educate our students about where our food comes from. The more our young leaders know about agriculture the better off our future will be.
