Carrie Lawson Robertson Grades: 6-8 **Paul Revere Charter Middle School and Magnet Center County: Los Angeles**

How and when did you first learn about Ag in the Classroom?

I learned about Ag in the Classroom from my mentor and former middle school horticulture teacher, Mr. Richard Herrera. He had attended the AITC conference several times, and raved about how fun and informative it was. I actually got my current job from him when he retired after starting this program! I've also had the pleasure of attending the conference with my former high school agriculture teacher, Mr. Steve Pietrolungo, (Mr. P.), of the Simi Valley Unified School District.



How long have you been teaching students about agriculture?

Since 1999, and I have been at my current school since 2011, originally teaching horticulture. I recently helped lead a major renovation and management of our entire school farm, located on Sunset Blvd. in Los Angeles and now teach Animal Science as well. So, I feel like I just started a new job!

What is your favorite AITC program/resource/event and why?

The AITC Annual Conference is by far my favorite event! I love bringing back videos and pictures to show my urban students what "real" agriculture looks like. I also make extensive use of the *What's Growin' On?* newspapers and the Commodity Fact Sheets. My kids and I are obsessed with the old *Imagine this...* cartoon illustration videos. They are hysterical!

Describe an agriculture-based project you have been involved in lately.

I have a thing for soil! My latest pet project is the launch of an extensive composting program to amend our very poor school farm soil. We are recycling waste from our animal pens, composting it for a year, and then applying it to our fields as a sustainable fertilizer and water retention tool. I'm also a little obsessed with our school potbelly pig, Daisy. She's adorable!

Do you have any advice for other teachers on how to implement agriculture into their classrooms?

Agriculture is everywhere! I can guarantee students have experienced agriculture, no matter where they come from, and all you have to do is make the connection! Food, clothing, air, water, tourism, pets, health, technology, marketing, transportation...it's all around us, every day! You do not need to have a school garden or farm to provide rich and engaging agricultural experiences for your students!

We have to ask, favorite California commodities?

Great question! I think my favorite has to be artichokes. I love the purple flower it makes, and as it grows in Santa Cruz, Watsonville, and Castroville areas, it reminds me of my travels there!
