Book of the Year


The American Farm Bureau Foundation for Agriculture announced its 17th "Book of the Year" award to "My Grandpa, My Tree, and Me."

Let's start with the basics: What is your favorite California commodity?

Strawberries!

How and when did you first learn about Ag in the Classroom?

I learned about Ag in the Classroom via an email. Another teacher forwarded me information about Ag in the Classroom's Taste and Teach program.

How long have you been teaching students

about agriculture?

I have been teaching students about agriculture for ten years, since our school opened.

What is your favorite AITC program, resource, or event, and why?

My favorite program is the Taste and Teach program in which kids learn about different CA grown commodities and then sample the commodities in a variety of ways.

Describe an agriculture-based project you have been involved with lately.

This year, we have been learning about apples. We picked apples from the orchard on our campus. The students created apple abstract art pieces and wrote narratives related to apples. The culminating event was a field trip to Abel's Acres, an apple orchard in Placerville, CA.

Do you have any advice for other teachers on how to implement agriculture into their classrooms?


Weave agriculture instruction into your ELA, science, and health lessons. Art is a great way to explore agriculture. Also, as a Hispanic teacher, I use agriculture to teach about many migrant farm workers' experiences throughout CA history. We use it as a springboard to teach about peaceful protests, advocacy, and about important CA leaders like Delores Huerta and Cesar Chavez.

Any Ag-ha moments in your classroom? Where agriculture came alive for your students?

Kids love trying new fruits and veggies. They oftentimes have never even tasted many of the commodities before our lesson, such as when we introduced figs. We also find that students learn and experience agriculture lessons in cross-age group activities where older kids help younger kids experience aspects of farming. Finally, parents who are usually reluctant to volunteer, love volunteering in classes when agriculture lessons are being taught!
