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

great and offers many resources and people to connect with. I also utilize the <u>What's Growing On'?</u> newspaper. I give it to all the students who visit our garden on field trips.

Do you have any advice for other teachers on how to implement agriculture into their classrooms?

My advice is to start simple and make it fun! I always incorporate a fun art or craft activity with a planting lesson. I emphasize that you do not need a big yard or a fancy garden plot to grow things. You can grow something in your windowsill.

Any Ag-ha moments in your classroom?

I hosted a Bake and Take class where we made pizzas in the pizza oven and discussed the ingredients (wheat for flour to make pizza dough, tomatoes for sauce, etc.), and where these items came from. Students started to make the connection and name other pizza toppings and how they were grown or produced.

What's your secret sauce to make your students interested in agriculture?


My secret sauce is to make agriculture exciting and fun. We read stories, make art, get our hands in the dirt, plant seeds, and create fun games and activities to engage students.

Why should teachers bring agriculture into their classrooms?

Teaching agriculture plants the seeds of curiosity. Children should know where their food comes from, and how it is grown. I hope someday one of my students returns and tells me they work with plants or animals in some way, shape or form!
