How and when did you first learn about Ag in the Classroom?

When we started our school garden, I searched for resources and grant opportunities to help fund our program. That's when I discovered Ag in the Classroom and was grateful for all their resources.

How long have you been teaching students about agriculture?

I have been teaching students about agriculture for seven years.

What is your favorite AITC program, resource, or event, and why?

The grants! Our program heavily relies on grants to keep it running. The Literacy for Life Grant allows us to bring literacy into our program and has awarded us with grants to support different projects, such as growing a blueberry patch and installing worm bins in a few of our garden beds.

Do you have any advice for other teachers on how to bring agriculture into their classrooms?

Give students the opportunity to grow their own food!

What's your secret sauce to make students interested in agriculture?

Teach them how to prepare the food they grow. My students can't wait to make new recipes with the produce grown in our garden. While one of the top favorites is butternut squash mac and cheese, my students beg for seconds of our sauteed greens!

Any "ag-ha" moments in your classroom? Where agriculture comes alive for your students? Harvesting potatoes! If you never had the chance to harvest potatoes, start growing them. Harvesting potatoes is so much fun! Kids are so surprised to find out how many potatoes they grew with just a few potato seeds!

Why should teachers bring agriculture into their classrooms?

Most people are out of touch with where their food actually comes from. Understanding how much time and effort goes into growing our own food gives us a better appreciation for all the work our farmers do to get food to our tables.
