Strike Gold in Your Classroom: Teaching California Agriculture After the Gold Rush

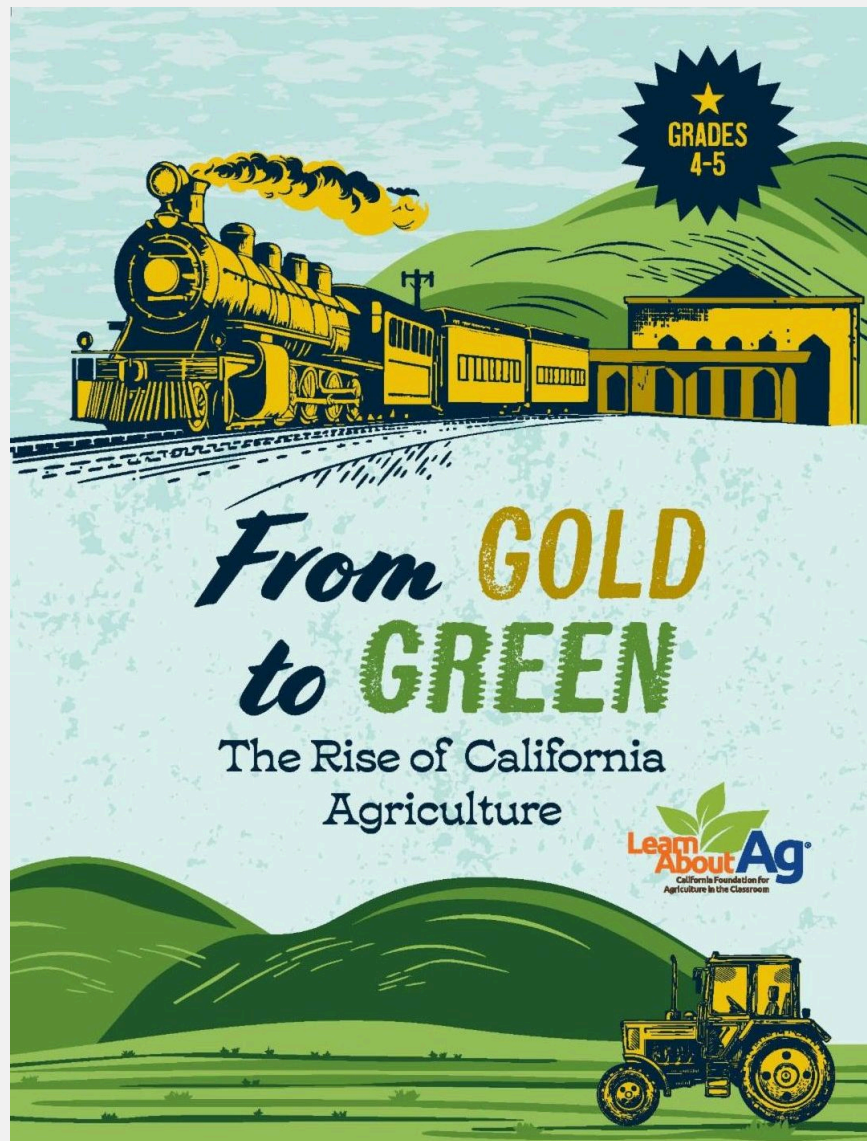

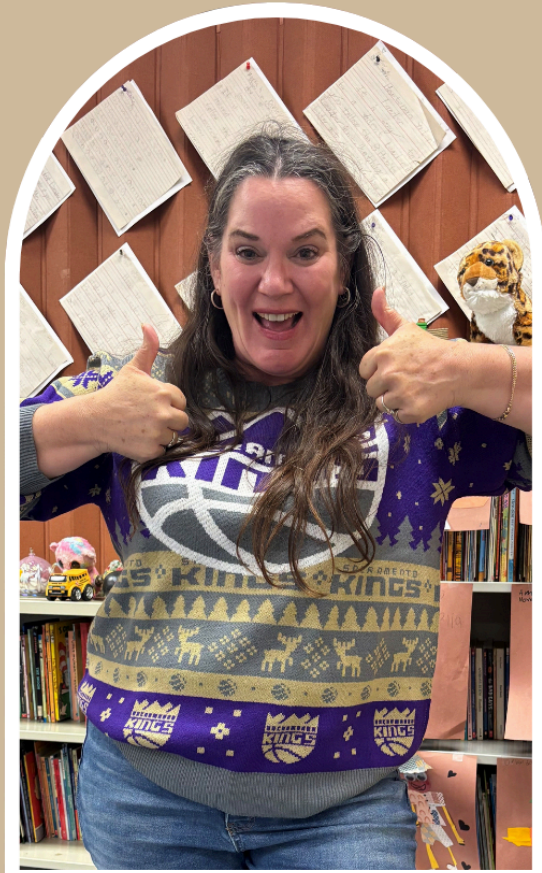

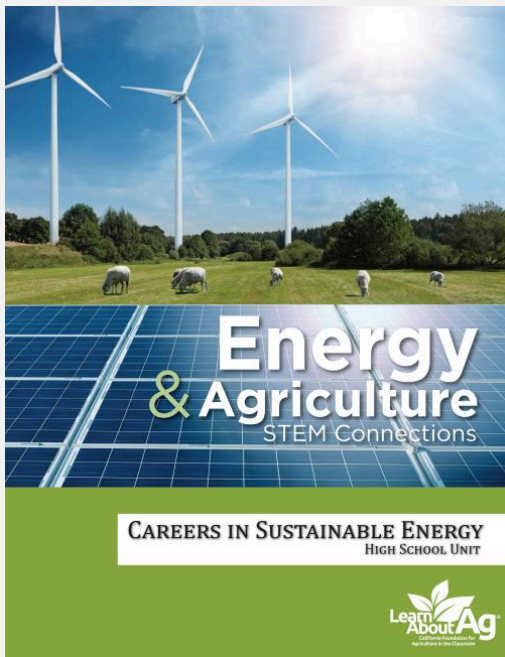
