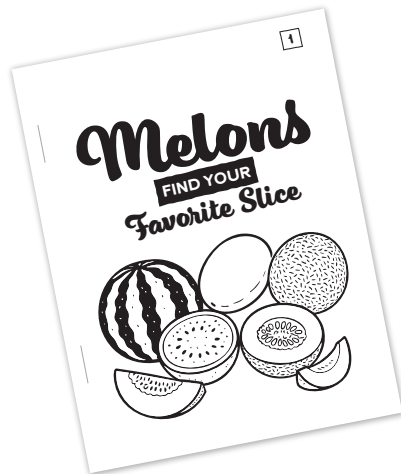
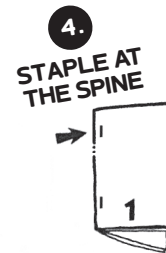
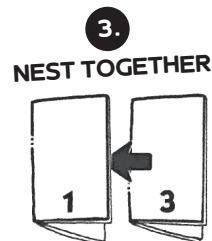
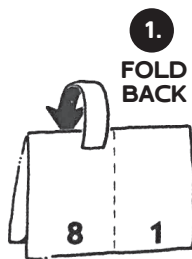
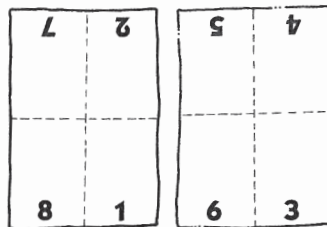


Assembling Mini Books

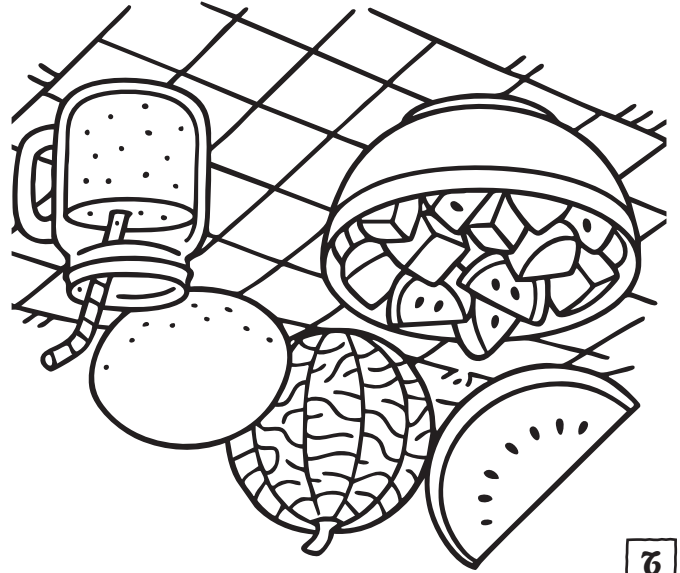

To assemble a book follow these simple instructions.

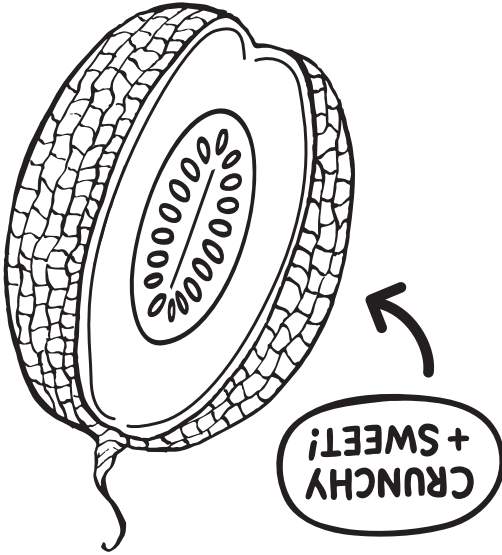

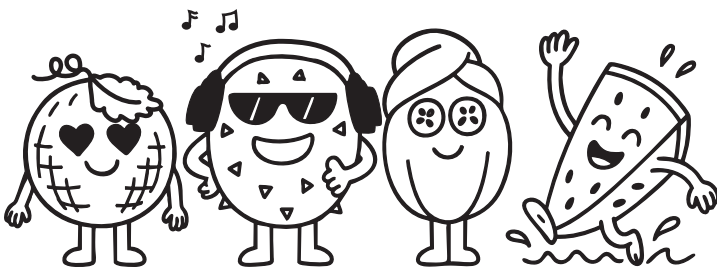

With so many melon varieties to explore, there's a juicy favorite for everyone. Whether you like sweet, crisp, smooth, or bold, there's a melon for you!

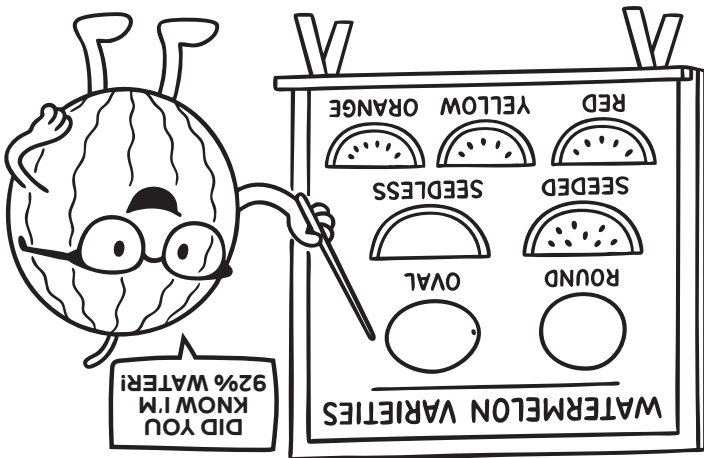

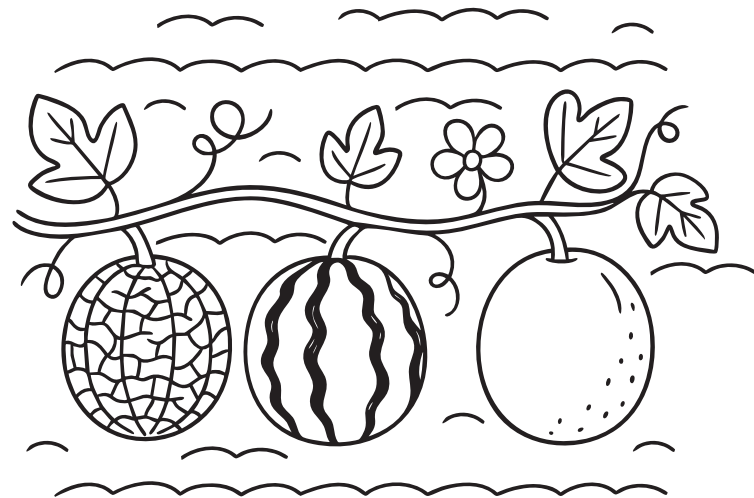
