The Colorado Literacy Project is an annual interactive learning experience where each participating class receives a FREE class kit complete with educational resources and enough supplies to complete hands-on activities



with students. The 2024 project featured Pueblo Chiles and used the book *Seed, Sprout, Spice! All About Pueblo Chiles*, published specifically for this project.

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
