## We've Been Busy Bees

If you study plants at the beginning of each year, this pollination activity is a favorite. This is a great follow up activity after reading the book, **From Seed to Plant** by Gail Gibbons

- 1. Each child decorates a flower.
- 2. Then they each make a bumble bee, glue it on a popsicle stick, and glue a cotton ball on the underside of the bee so there will be something for the "pollen" to stick to. If you don't want to make a bee or don't have time, you can buy tagboard bees at the dollar store, and use them. They are very durable...and cheap!
- 3. Glue a cupcake liner to the middle of the flower and put a spoonful of "pollen" (yellow cake mix, lemon is good too) in the cup.
  - 4. Have the kids dip their bees in the pollen and then fly around and pollinate all the other flowers in the room.

If your students need a hive for their bee to fly back to, take bubble wrap, paint the bumpy side with brown or tan paint, carefully place the painted side down on a yellow paper with a hive drawn or copied on it. Remove bubble wrap and discard. Let hive dry, cut a slit in it and student can slip the popsicle stick in and the bee is home!
