

## Questions for Commodity Bingo

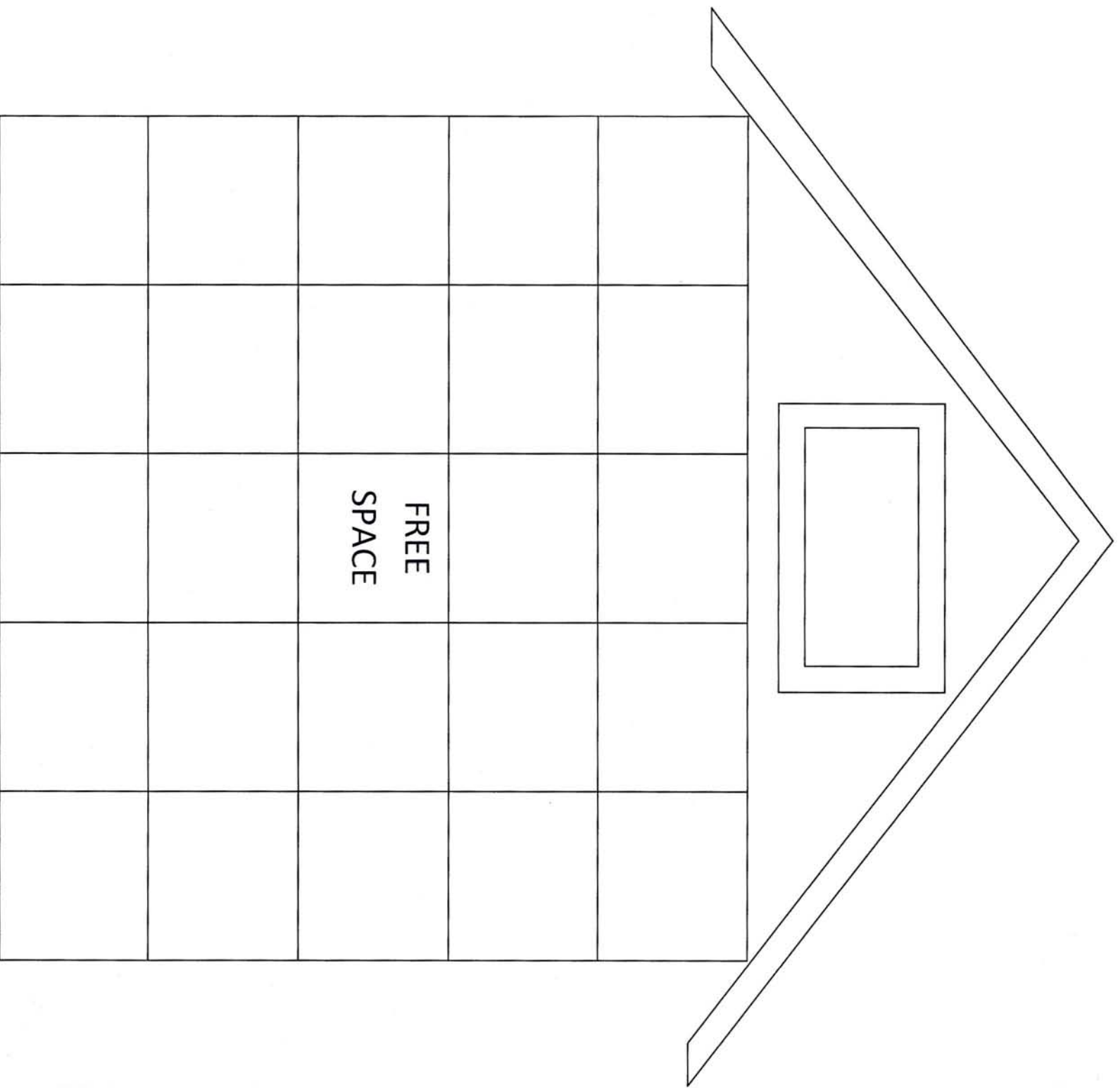
Using your Idaho is Rich with Agriculture sheet, fill in each space on your Commodity Bingo card. Do not use a commodity more than once.

Now you are ready to play Commodity Bingo. Why not use beans or other Idaho grown seeds as markers?

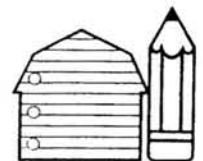
