There are six main breeds of dairy cows. The main breeds are Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Holstein, Jersey, and Milking Shorthorn.

The greatest amount of milk produced in one year was 5%,2% pounds by a Holstein cow named Robthom Sue Paddy.

The average American consumes almost 25 gallons of milk a year.

U.S. dairy farms produce roughly 21 billion gallons of milk annually.
