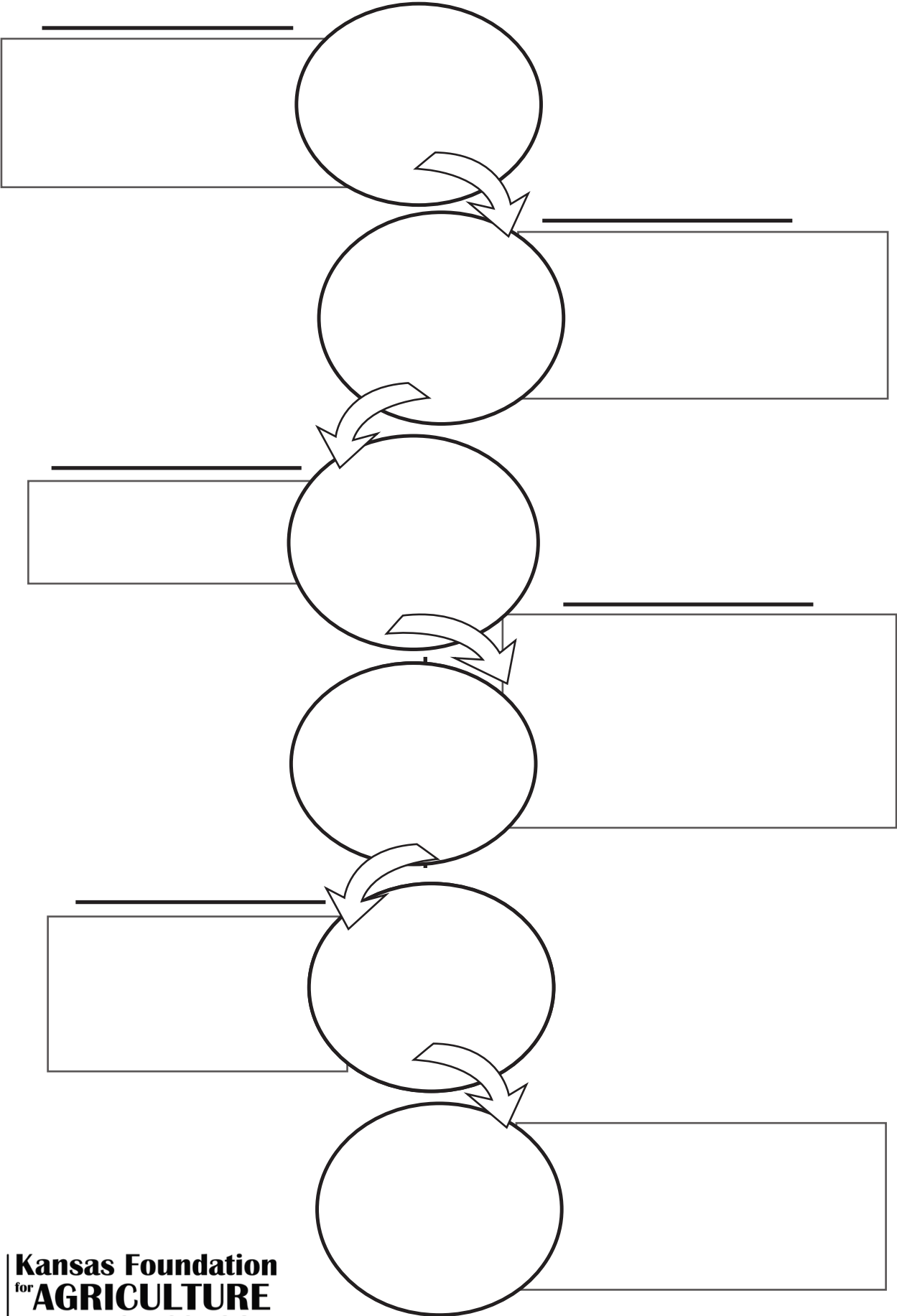


Name: _____ **WHEAT GROWTH CYCLE**



The planted seed germinates, where the seed has started to grow and broken the seed coat

The shoots continue to grow forming nodes and eventually leaves.

The wheat plant is full-grown but ripens from the color green to a golden color. Once the wheat plant is ripe, it is ready to be harvested.

The head has fully emerged. The number of flowers pollinated determines the number of kernels per head.

Roots form and the first shoot, also called a tiller, grows up from the ground.

The head of the wheat plant continues to grow upward until the last leaf unwraps from around it.
