Make a Wet-Bulb Thermometer

Materials:

- □1 dry-bulb thermometer (mercury free)
- \square 6-inch long piece of hollow cotton shoelace with the plastic tips cut off
- □1 twist tie
- 1. Insert the bulb of the thermometer about 1 inch into the shoelace.
- 2. Use the twist tie to attach the shoelace to the thermometer just above the bulb.
- 3. Stick at least 3 inches of the opposite end of the shoelace into a container of water.
- 4. Use the relative humidity chart to compare the air temperature (dry-bulb reading) with the wet-bulb temperature to determine relative humidity.
