Victims of conflict

- ✓ internally displaced people
- √ refugees
- → landless returnees
- ✓ landmine disabled
- war invalids
- war widows and orphans

Migrant workers and their families

- migrant herders tending other people's herds
- → migrant laborers seeking seasonal work
- √ female-headed households left behind by male migrant laborers

Marginal populations in urban areas

- school dropouts
- unemployed people
- recently arrived migrants
- people living in slums on city outskirts
- dock workers and porters and construction workers
- workers in the informal section
- → homeless people
- ✓ orphans
- street children and people living alone on small fixed incomes or without support (elderly, pensioners, widows and widowers, divorcees, invalids, handicapped people)
- → beggars

Dependent people living alone or in low-income households with large family size

- ✓ elderly people
- → women of childbearing age, especially pregnant and nursing mothers
- → children under five years old, especially infants

Some or all members of low-income households within vulnerable livelihood systems

- ✓ subsistence or small-scale farmers
- ✓ female-headed farming households
- √ landless peasants
- agricultural laborers
- ✓ fishers
- nomadic pastoralists
- ✓ sedentary herders, small-scale livestock producers, and agropastoralists
- ✓ forest dwellers
- → peri-urban small-scale agricultural producers and market gardeners
- → day or contract laborers
