<p><b>Answer:</b> A calf can stand and walk as soon as it's born.</p> <p><b>Question:</b> What does a newborn calf eat?</p>	<p><b>Answer:</b> Its mother's milk</p> <p><b>Question:</b> How much do newborn calves usually weigh?</p>
<p><b>Answer:</b> Between 55 and 90 pounds</p> <p><b>Question:</b> What does it mean for an animal to be weaned?</p>	<p><b>Answer:</b> They no longer drink their mother's milk.</p> <p><b>Question:</b> How old are calves when they are weaned?</p>
<p><b>Answer:</b> About six months old</p> <p><b>Question:</b> What are the people who care for weaned calves called?</p>	<p><b>Answer:</b> Stockers or backgrounders</p> <p><b>Question:</b> What do cattle eat during backgrounding?</p>
<p><b>Answer:</b> Mostly grasses or other plants they find on the range.</p> <p><b>Question:</b> Where do beef cattle go after backgrounding?</p>	<p><b>Answer:</b> Feedlots or feedyards</p> <p><b>Question:</b> What do cattle eat at feedlots?</p>

<p><b>Answer:</b> Grain and hay</p> <p><b>Question:</b> How long do beef cattle spend at the feedlot?</p>	<p><b>Answer:</b> Four to six months</p> <p><b>Question:</b> What is the leading source of farm income in Utah?</p>
<p><b>Answer:</b> Beef cattle</p> <p><b>Question:</b> What are cattle that are or will become fathers called?</p>	<p><b>Answer:</b> Bulls</p> <p><b>Question:</b> What are male cattle that are only raised for meat called?</p>

<p><b>Answer:</b> Between 1100 and 2800 pounds (499 and 1270 kg)</p> <p><b>Question:</b> How much does a full grown cow weigh?</p>	<p><b>Answer:</b> Between 850 and 1800 pounds (385 and 816 kg)</p> <p><b>Question:</b> What are animals with four-compartment stomachs called?</p>
<p><b>Answer:</b> Ruminants</p> <p><b>Question:</b> Can humans digest grass?</p>	<p><b>Answer:</b> No, humans cannot digest the cellulose in grass.</p> <p><b>Question:</b> What are the two main uses for cattle?</p>
