## Designing Kid-friendly Landscapes

- Don't purchase delicate and thorny plants – try ornamental grasses because they are soft yet tough

- Incorporate a water feature like a wading pond
- Use that gazebo for entertaining in the evening hours and as a fort or playhouse during the day
- Try some container gardens – a great way to add color all year around – try some unique plants and move them around

## Background Information

When hearing the word agriculture, most people think of corn and soybeans, cows and pigs, and that classic picture of an American farm. But, did you know that the nursery, greenhouse and landscape industry is part of Minnesota agriculture and is valued at over \$3.5 billion annually and growing!

Nationally, horticultural production is also the fastest growing segment of agriculture. The growing of trees, shrubs, perennials, annuals and potted flowering plants is recognized by the U.S. Department of Agriculture as "specialty crop farming".

## Urban Agriculture

The nursery, greenhouse and landscape industry reaches into every corner of Minnesota, especially in the Twin Cities metro area where over half of the state's sales occur. You'll know that for sure when venturing out the Saturday before Mother's Day to pick up a plant or two for mom! In addition, nursery and greenhouse crops that are grown in Minnesota are exported to nearly every state and into Canada, as well as to countries overseas.

## Agricultural Production Important to Minnesota's Economy

- 22,000 acres of Minnesota land is used in the production of woody plants and field grown perennials
- Minnesota growers use 13,000 million square feet of greenhouse space
