Executive Director's Message

Here at the National Agriculture in the Classroom Organization (NAITCO), we strive to develop relevant, standards-based PreK through 12th

grade lesson plans and companion resources, offer teacher inservice and preservice workshops, conduct agricultural literacy reading programs in elementary schools, and provide grant programs and other initiatives to help teachers educate students about the importance of agriculture in their daily lives.

In 2022, we hosted the National Agriculture in the Classroom National Conference in Saratoga Springs, New York in person for more than 700 attendees and virtually provided 800 registered educators resources on how to use agricultural concepts as teaching tools in their classrooms, farm tours, and workshops. We honored eight teachers with the 2022 National Excellence in Teaching About Agriculture Award for their innovative ways they use agricultural concepts in their classroom instruction.

NAITCO provided grant funding to new, existing, or professional development projects submitted by nine Agriculture in the Classroom (AITC) state and territory programs.

Our partners at The National Center for Agricultural Literacy continued the expansion of the National Agricultural Literacy Curriculum Matrix, a searchable database of hunreds of preK-12 lessons and companion resources.

NAITCO leveraged the combined state budgets of approximately \$14.5 million with grant funding received from USDA/NIFA and support from Nutrien, Ltd. and CHS Foundation.

With our partners, we can accomplish anything.I look forward to the exciting future all AITC programs have in front of us.
