Here at the National Agriculture in the Classroom Organization (NAITCO), we strive to

develop relevant standards-based PreK through 12th grade lesson plans and companion resources, offer teacher inservice and preservice professional development opportunities, and provide grant programs and other initiatives to help state and territory Agriculture in the Classroom (AITC) programs build capacity and increase their impact.

The National Agriculture in the Classroom Conference continues to grow, and in 2023, National Agriculture in the Classroom hosted the National Conference, "Beyond the Beaches" in Orlando, Florida in-person for more than 500 attendees. Attendees were able to choose from more than 90 professional development opportunities. We also honored eight teachers with the 2023 National Excellence in Teaching About Agriculture Award for their innovative ways they use agricultural concepts in their classroom instruction. A virtual version of the conference was produced in July of 2023 for more than 200 attendees. NAITCO provided grant funding to programming and professional development projects submitted by nine Agriculture in the Classroom (AITC) state and territory programs.

Our partners at The National Center for Agricultural Literacy continued the expansion of the National Agricultural Literacy Curriculum Matrix, a searchable database of hundreds of preK-12 lessons and companion resources and provided valuable professional development for program leaders and educators.

NAITCO leveraged the combined state budgets of approximately \$15.9 million with grant funding received from USDA/NIFA and financial support from our valuable sponsors. We are truly grateful for all of our funding partners that help us accomplish our mission.

With our partners, we can accomplish anything. I look forward to the exciting future all AITC programs have in front of us.
