Executive Director's Message

In 2024, National Agriculture in the Classroom Organization (NAITCO) continued to provide premier professional development

and classroom resources in agricultural literacy to teachers and students across the country. By supporting the efforts of the state and territory Agriculture in the Classroom (AITC) programs, the nationwide impact nearly doubled from 2023 and is on pace to return to pre-pandemic numbers. The dedicated program staff, volunteers and enthusiastic educators from around the country have helped propel us along on our mission of increasing agricultural literacy.

We hosted the 2024 National Agriculture in the Classroom Conference, "Agriculture Elevated", in Salt Lake City, Utah in-person for more than 550 attendees. At the conference, eight teachers were honored with the 2024 National Excellence in Teaching About Agriculture Award for their innovative ways they use agricultural concepts in their classroom instruction. A virtual version of the conference was provided for 247 attendees in July 2024. Even though our grant funding was limited, NAITCO was still able to provide grant funding to state and territory AITC programs for professional development, capacity building, and programming. Our partners at The National





Center for Agricultural Literacy continued the expansion of the National Agricultural Literacy Curriculum Matrix, a searchable database of hundreds of preK-12 lessons and companion resources.

NAITCO leveraged the combined state budgets of approximately \$17.8 million with grant funding received from USDA/NIFA and financial support from valuable sponsors. We are truly grateful for all of our funding partners that help us accomplish our mission.

Together, we are showcasing agricultural opportunities and careers to future generations to have a better understanding of the food and fiber systems relied on every day. I look forward to an exciting future of helping teachers become more comfortable with the subject of agriculture.

The size and scope of AITC state and territory programs vary widely across the country. The NAITCO provides leadership at the national level to apply for federal grant funding to support a national website. a searchable database of standardsbased lesson plans and resources, a national conference, a national teacher awards program for AITC state and territory programs, and professional development opportunities for AITC state and territory programs. In addition, it seeks sponsorships and partnerships with national agribusinesses and organizations with an interest in Pre-K-12 agricultural literacy.
