American Egg Board www.aeb.org This is a national organization dedicated to educating consumers (professionals, retailers, educators, etc) about the *Incredible Edible Egg*. The "For Educators" section provides lesson plans for K-12 which are linked to the Common Core and Next Generation Science Standards. In the "Merchandise" section they have educational materials which include posters, activity and fact booklets, videos, and more.

"Egg Facts & Fun" provides a history of chicken domestication and egg production, nutritional information, safety tips, an Eggcyclopedia packed with information, and general egg trivia.
