

My Family's Turkey Farm

<u>Objective</u>: Students will read a book and/or watch a video to learn to identify stages of a turkey's life cycle and how farmers take care of turkeys.

Objective: Students will be able to:

Identify stages of a turkey's life cycle. Explain how farmers take care of turkeys.

Grades: 3-5, can be modified for older grades

Materials:

My Family's Turkey Farm by Katie Olthoff – paperback book or

My Family's Turkey Farm - read aloud or

My Family's Turkey Farm - pdf version

Ashley Farms, Turkey Farm video

Let's Talk Turkey: Literacy powerpoint presentation

My Family's Turkey Farm Student Lapbook Pages, one per student

Print pages 1, 2, and 7-9 single-sided

Print pages 3-6 double-sided

My Family's Turkey Farm Teacher Lapbook

File folder for each student Scissors Glue sticks Poultry AgMag *(optional)*

Procedure:

Students will read the book *My Family's Turkey Farm*. This may be introduced as a whole class with one read through by the teacher or with the read aloud version, in small groups with the paperback book, or individually with the pdf version. Show the *Ashley Farms*, *Turkey Farm* video.



Talk about some of the main ideas the students took away from the book and the video. Next, students will create a lap book that will contain key information from the reading and the video.

Print out the My Family's Turkey Farm Student Lapbook Pages. Show the *Let's Talk Turkey: Literacy* powerpoint with instructions on how to assemble the lapbook. The Teacher Pages have suggested answers or where to find the information.

When they are finished constructing the lapbook, students can draw a picture of a turkey or the farm on the cover and share their favorite fun fact.
