
News of the Month

December is a great time to learn about Christmas tree farming in New Jersey. The state's 639 Christmas tree farms, which spread over 5,300 acres, sell 85,000 trees each year.

A fun fact: the very first Christmas tree farm in America was planted in Hamilton, New Jersey in 1901.

If you're looking for a fun and educational project for those last days of school before winter break, try making seed necklaces, an activity that engages all students PreK-5. (Older students can germinate seeds without the necklace.) Students can take their necklaces home and watch their seeds germinate and grow during their vacation.
