

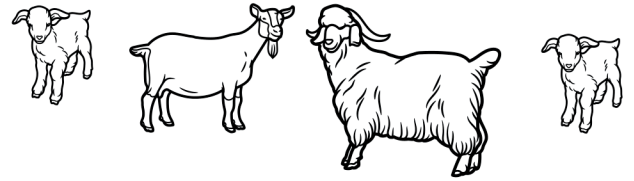

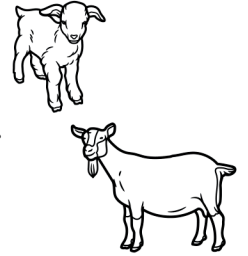

4. Weaving - technique for interlacing two or more strands of yarn, twine, or thin strips of material to make a fabric.



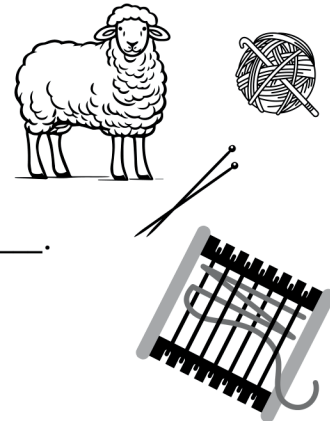

1. Agriculture - farmers and ranchers grow and produce the crops (plants) and livestock (animals) for what we eat, wear, and use every day.
2. Livestock - farm/ranch animals grown for food, fiber, and other uses (ex: goats).
3. Crops - farm plants grown to be food, fiber, and other uses (ex: cotton or chile).
4. Natural Resources - materials/energy sourced on Earth that are used to support life and meet people's needs (ex: soil, water, air, sun).
5. Fiber - long, slender, and flexible structures made from certain proteins that resemble thread to be made into fabrics and textiles (ex: mohair, wool, fur).
6. Mohair - fiber/hair of the Angora goat made into a fabric or yarn.
7. Wool - fiber/hair of sheep made into a fabric or yarn.
8. Spinning - process of twisting fibers (like wool or mohair) to form yarn.
9. Weaving - technique for interlacing two or more strands of yarn, twine, or thin strips of material to make a fabric.
10. Regalia - traditional/sacred clothing, accessories and artifacts worn or carried during various ceremonies for indigenous and native tribal members.
11. Fancy Dance - style of dance some believe was created by members of the Ponca Tribe in the 1920's - 1930's, to help preserve their culture and faith.



### What is the process of creating yarn out of goat's mohair or sheep's wool?

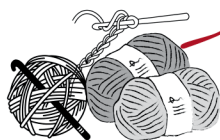
1. Draw a line to connect the processes picture with the description of creating yarn from the fibers grown on goats and sheep - a brief "start to finish" view (there are 4 options to choose from). Good luck!

Fleece will be processed, which means it will be washed and carded (combing the fibers to help strands lay in one direction).

Goats and sheep grow a healthy and strong fleece by eating nutritious forage and being limited to stressful factors.

After processing, the mohair or wool is spun into yarn and packaged so it can be used to create usable items.

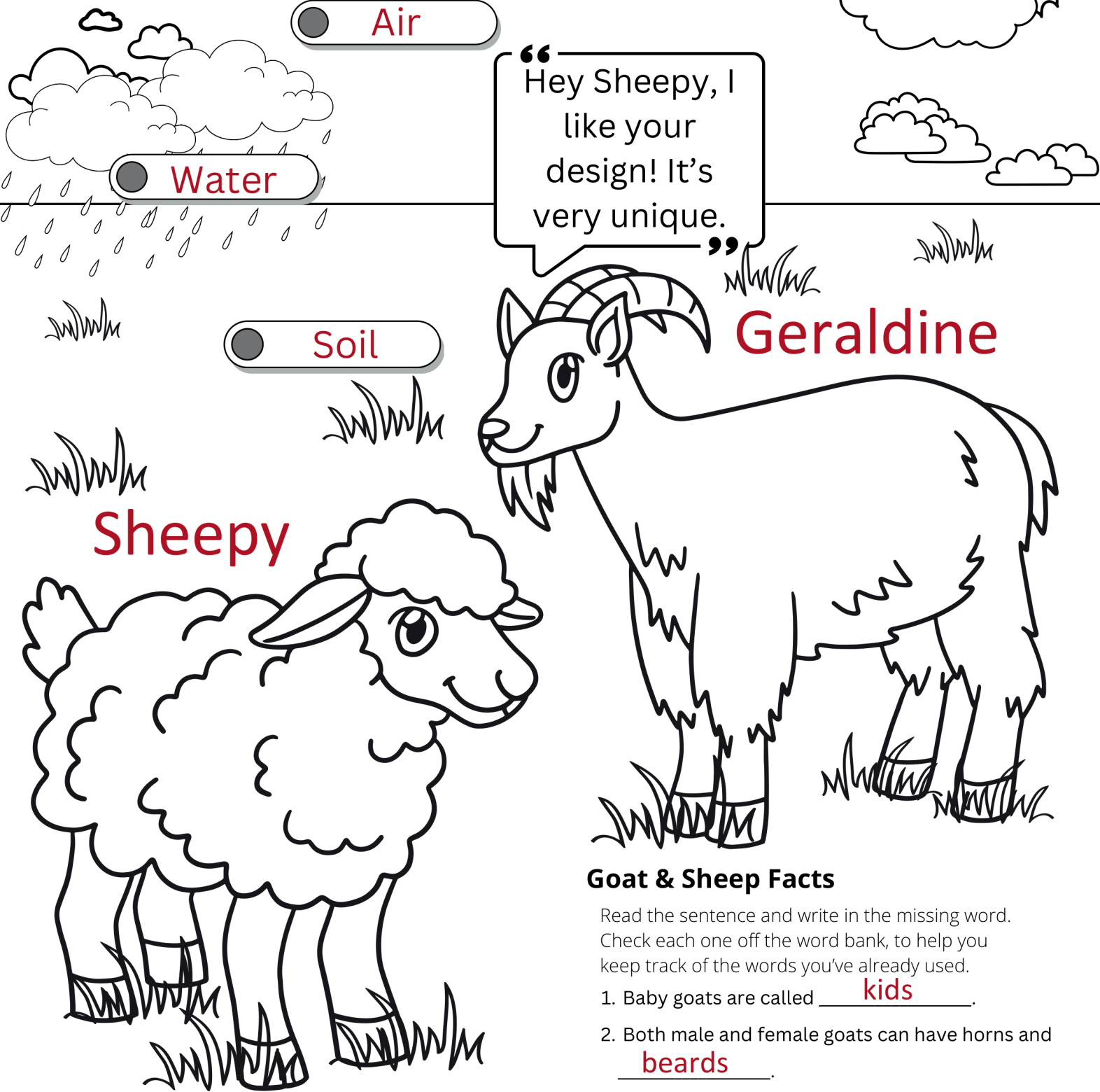
Goats and sheep are sheared 1-2x/year to collect the fleece (a full body clipping). After shearing, the fleece is sent to be processed.
