# SHEEP & GOATS

Sheep are primarily used for wool and meat, while goats are used for meat, milk, and fiber.

## Sheep Facts

- The Navajo Churro is the oldest breed of sheep in the U.S.
- Wool sheep are usually shorn once a year.
- Fat from sheep, also known as tallow, can be used to make candles and soaps.

## Sheep Vocabulary

- **LAMB** - is a baby sheep.
- **EWE** - is an adult female sheep.
- **RAM** - is an adult male sheep.
- **WHETHER** - is a male that has been castrated (neutered).



## Goat Vocabulary

- **KID** - is a baby goat.
- **DOE/NANNY** - is an adult female.
- **BUCK/BILLY** - is an adult male.
- **WHETHER** - is a male goat OR sheep that's been castrated - similar to neutering a dog or cat.
- **KIDDING** - is the act of giving birth.
