## The Beeman by Laurie Krebs and Valeria Cis



<u>Hive</u> – the shelter (house) where a colony (group) of bees live

<u>Cotton</u> – a soft usually white fluffy material that is made up of the hairs around the seeds of a tall plant related to the mallows and that is spun into yarn

<u>Hive Bodies</u> – the boxes where bees live, store honey and raise young bees; also called a deep or shallow

Smoker – a tool that gives off smoke that is used to calm bees

Queen Bee – the largest female bee who is the center of the hive, usually the only one to lay eggs

<u>Drone Bee</u> – male bee usually does not collect pollen, their job is to mate with the queen

Worker Bee – female bee specialized to collect food and maintain the hive

<u>House Bee</u> – bees that move around the hive drying the nectar as the worker bees deliver it, they clean the honey

<u>Nectar</u> – a sweet liquid given off by plants and especially by the flowers and used by bees in making honey

<u>Honeycomb</u> – a shelter of six-sided wax cells built by honeybees in their nest to contain young bees and stores of honey

<u>Extractor</u> – a drum containing a rotating wire basket that is turned by hand or motor, the honeycombs are placed in the basket and as it turns the is flung out of the combs into a tank <u>Pollination</u> – when bees travel from plant to plant collecting pollen and leaving some at each plant to fertilize the flowers

<u>Pollen</u> - small spores from a plant that appear as a dust, necessary for plant reproduction, contain the DNA of plants; used by bees for food

<u>Hatch</u> – a small door or opening, here it's in the ceiling

<u>Wax</u> – a yellowish moldable substance produced by bees and used by them for making the honeycomb (also called *beeswax*)

<u>Queen Bee</u> – the largest female bee who is the center of the hive, usually the only one to lay eggs

<u>Drone Bee</u> – male bee usually does not collect pollen

Worker Bee – female bee specialized to collect food and maintain the hive

Hive – the shelter (house) where a colony (group) of bees live

Forage – to search for food or supplies

<u>Clover</u> – a plant that has three leaves and white or purple flowers, a source of nectar for bees <u>Propeller</u> – a device with blades that is made to turn rapidly by an engine to move something, used especially for propelling airplanes and ships

<u>Nectar</u> – a sweet liquid given off by plants and especially by the flowers and used by bees in making honey

<u>Pollen baskets</u> – an area on the back legs of bees where they store pollen during pollination, also called honey sacs

Evaporate – when the water on the surface heats up and turns into gas

Burrow – a hole in the ground made by an animal for shelter or protection

<u>Honeycomb</u> – a shelter of six-sided wax cells built by honeybees in their nest to contain young bees and stores of honey
