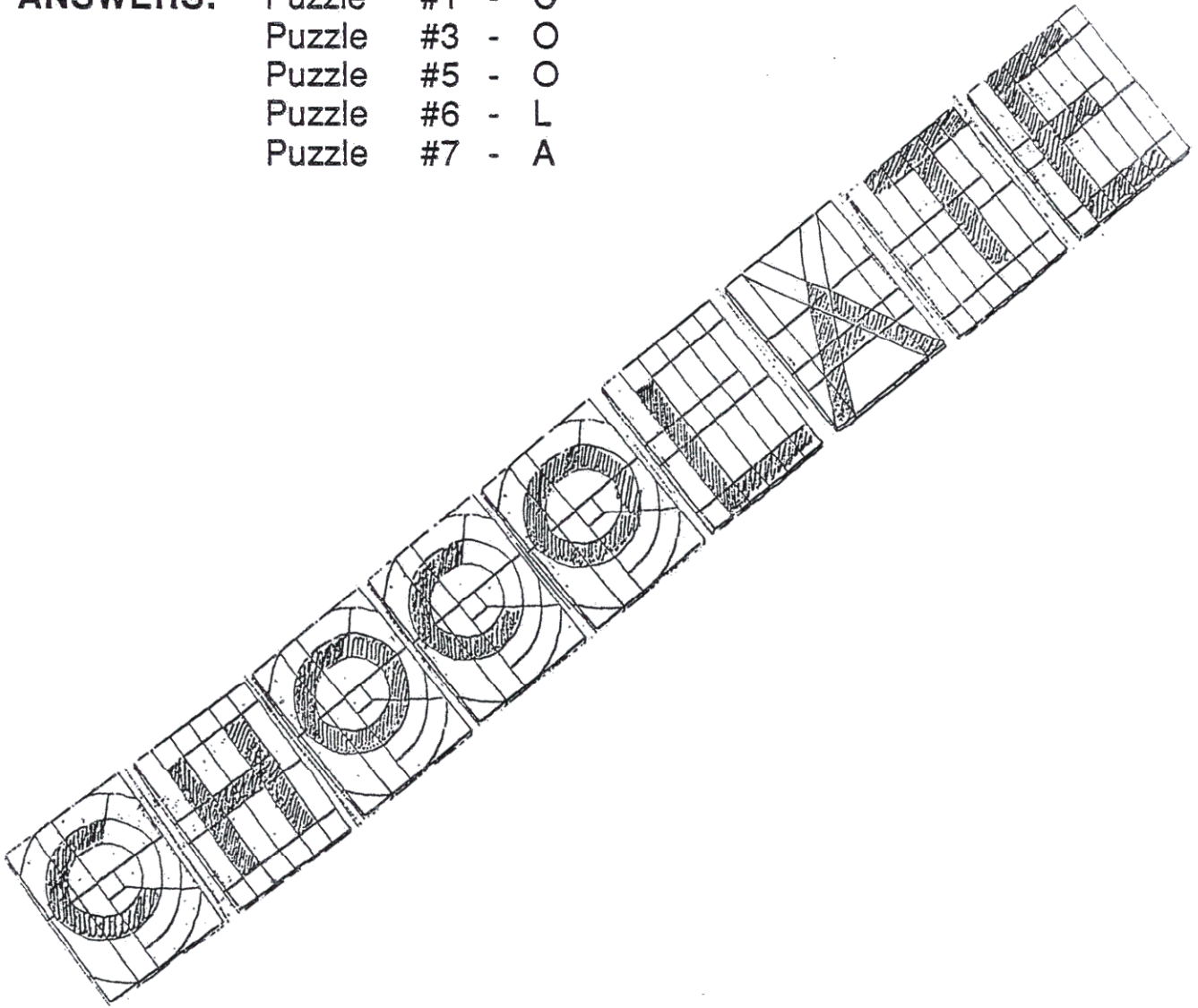
OBJECTIVES: The students will complete puzzles 1, 3, 5, 6, and 7 in conjunction with Math puzzles 2, 4, 8, 9 to form the word chocolate.

BACKGROUND: These lessons make a game out of identifying vowel sounds. The "payoff" with these and the Math lessons is to spell the word chocolate.

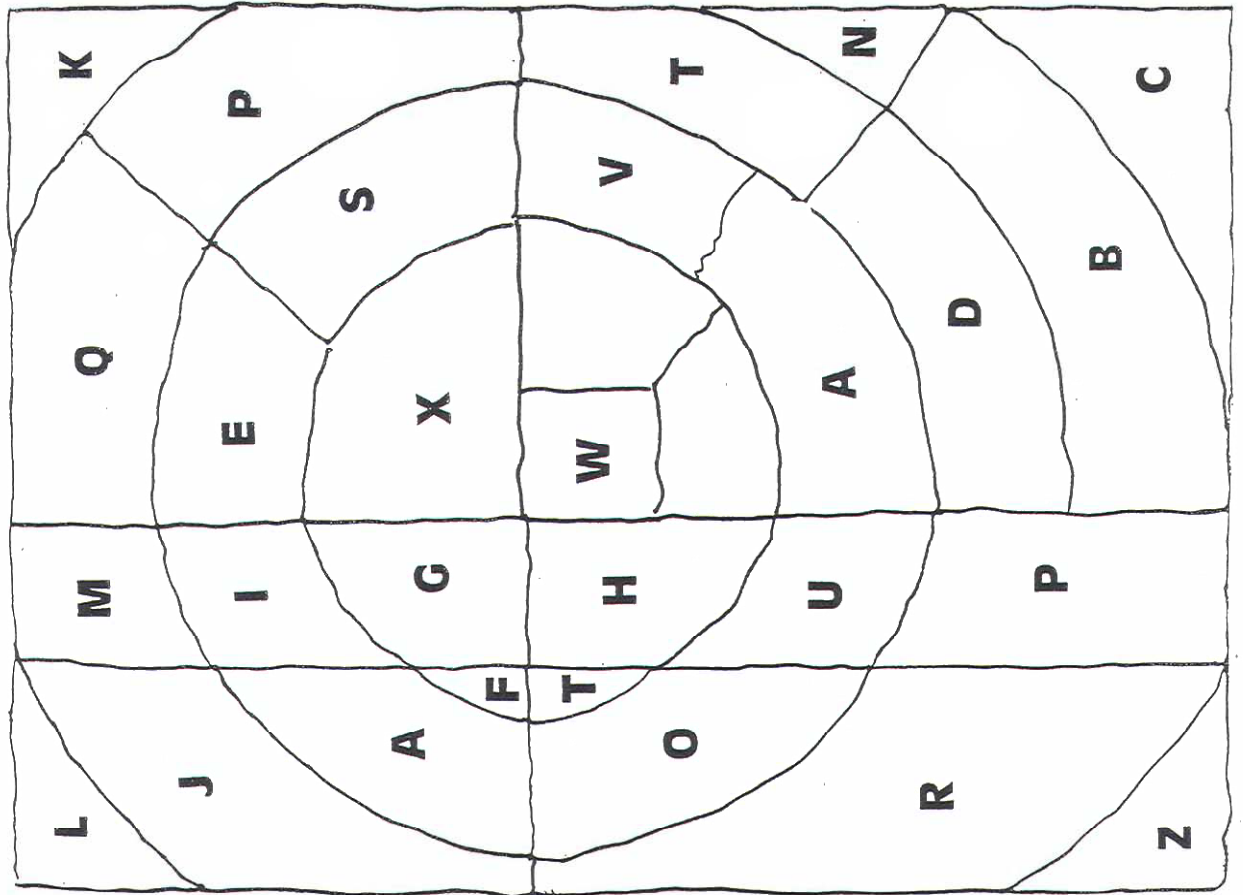
- ACTIVITIES:**
1. Have the students complete puzzle #1 by coloring brown the sections containing vowels and #3 by coloring brown the words with a "long a" sound (they are on the same page).
 2. Have the students complete puzzle #5 by coloring brown all the sections containing words with a "short a" sound and puzzle #6 by coloring brown all the sections with a "short e" sound.
 3. Have the students complete puzzle #7 by coloring brown all those sections with a "long o" sound.
 4. Have the students complete these puzzles in conjunction with puzzles #2, 4, 8, and 9.

- When all 9 puzzles are complete, have the students tape them together--sequentially--to spell the word chocolate.
- Complete the other lessons on chocolate.

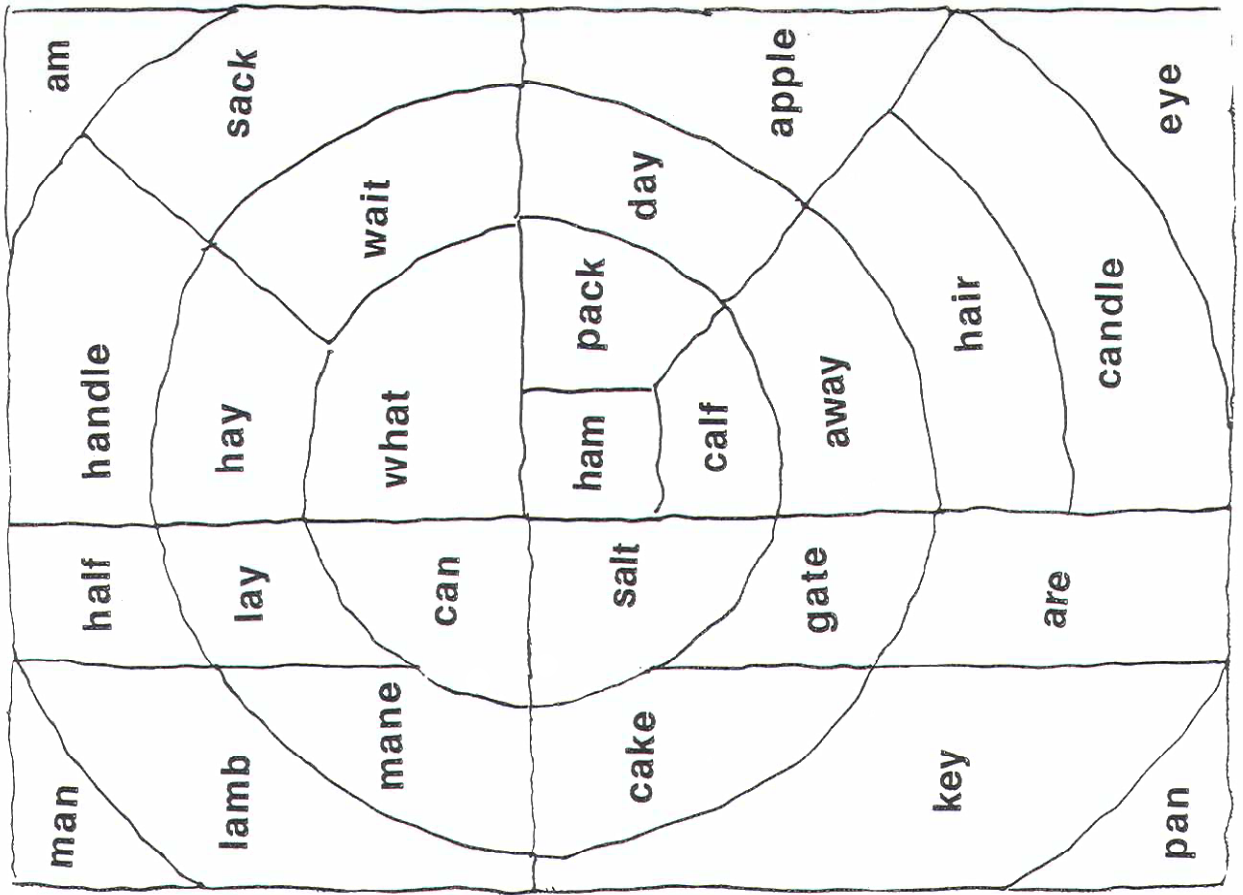
