TEACHER MATERIALS - The Senses

CONCEPT:

ELA

-Standard 1.1- Listening and Reading

Career Development

-Standard 3a.1- Basic Skills

OBJECTIVE:

The students will explore the senses of sight, hearing, touch, taste, and smell in describing various items they come in contact with.

BACKGROUND: An awareness of the environment, tastes, smells, sounds, and tactile feelings is important to appreciate what we have. Being able to express one's self and be creative in doing so is another skill to be developed.

ACTIVITY:

- 1. Choose a color a week and each day explore what that "color" means in terms of senses. In other words—on Monday of the first week, you ask the students to describe what yellow smells
 - on Tuesday, what does yellow taste like?
 - on Wednesday, what does yellow feel like?
 - on Thursday, what does yellow sound like?

Make a chart on the bulletin board.

2. On Friday, have the students paint, fingerpaint, or draw the feelings which best describes yellow to them.

On the following pages is a listing of what some colors sound, smell, taste, and feel like to the author.

- 3. Have the students act out some colors, smells, etc.
- 4. Tie the alphabet to this with the first letter of the item selected. i.e. if brown looks like mud, the letter M should be highlighted. Be cautious of words used.
- 5. Develop a collage for each color of items either drawn or cut

from magazines. Attach real items as well.

Have the students sort colors of items into colored boxes after cutting items out of magazines.



- 7. Tie in nutrition, snacks, and flavors. Bring in spices and have the students smell the spices and tell what it smells like.
 - i.e. oregano smells like pizza cinnamon smells like apple pie
