I live on a dairy farm where we raise registered Holsteins and also grow other NY agricultural products. Milk and dairy products are New York State's largest agricultural product and I am happy to be a part of that! Even though there aren't many dairy farmers left compared to many years ago, we still produce a lot of milk and dairy products for everyone to enjoy!

This year my family and I tapped some of our maple trees and got to have some fresh maple syrup that was made from the sap. New York ranks second in maple production. Nothing beats having the real syrup on my pancakes instead of the fake kind! Our family also sells garden compost in the spring from composted manure made from our cows and the bedding. Gardeners love this fresh, rich compost. New York ranks 3rd in Nursery and greenhouse products. It seems funny that people have to buy compost that we take for granted, but not many people live on farms anymore, and they still like to garden and grow flowers and vegetables.

We also have a few chickens on our farm and I sell the eggs. In the summer I sell them at a local Farmers Market and I sold out so fast! People loved the farm fresh eggs. NY ranks 25th in the country for egg production. Our family also raises a few beef and pigs during the year. We not only use the meat for our family, but also raise extra for other families to purchase.

I now understand how important Agriculture is in New York State. In fact, NY Agriculture brings in over 5 billion dollars of business to our state every year! Although my family and I have a small farm, we raise many products that NY is known for. I am very lucky to live on a farm and understand where my food comes from, how it is grown and know the importance of Agriculture.

When I am at the local and county fairs in the summer, I enter my 4-H projects which include fresh vegetables, eggs and showing our dairy and swine projects.
