# Apple Globe 

Children will learn that Virginia growers produce an average of 8 to 10 million bushels of apples per year.

## Directions

1. Read Apples to a group of children.
2. Discuss new facts that children learned from the book.
3. Pass out 4 red strips of construction paper to each child. 4. Older children may wish to cut their own strips of construction paper.
4. Lay the strips on a flat surface so that they form a star.
5. Tape the strips together at the middle meeting point (you may also use a stapler).
6. Gather the ends to form an apple shape. Staple strips together at the top.
7. Draw and cut out a leaf from the green construction paper.
8. Staple, glue, or use a brad fastener to adhere leaf to top of apple.

## Supplies

- Apples by Gail Gibbons
- $4,1 / 2$ " $\times 12$," red strips of construction paper per student
- Tape
- Stapler Scissors
- Green Construction paper
