

Textile Weaving

Learn how natural fibers create fabric for clothing and other goods.

Directions

- 1. Explain that weaving is a textile craft in which yarn or thread is interlaced to form a fabric. Discuss how weaving was done in the past versus how it is done in the present day.
- 2. Give each student a paper grid template. Fold in half and cut along the lines. Start from the folded end and be careful to stop where the line ends.
 Unfold.
- 3. Use multicolored yarn (1-2 yards per student) or strips of paper to weave by alternating over and under the paper grid.

Supplies

- Grid template, attached
- Yarn or strips of paper
- Scissors

Extension Ideas

 Once fibers have been woven to create fabric, they are often dyed.
 Demonstrate this through a tie-dye activity. You may choose to tie-dye white cotton t-shirts or bandanas.
 You can also talk about plant based dyes and experiment by creating your own.
