#### **Directions**

Prior to beginning the activity:

• Read Down on the Farm.


like corn and wheat in their diet.

- Discuss the foods that animals eat:
   Cattle: grass, grain, silage; Poultry: feed
   that includes grains and nutrients; Horses:
   hay, grain, apples; Other animals have grains
  - 1. Point out that cereals are made from grains including corn and wheat.
  - 2. Share that many animals also eat fruits and nuts.
  - 3. Fill bowls with each type of food. Place a spoon in each bowl.
  - 4. Assist children in putting 1 spoon full of each type of food into a snack bag.
  - 5. Munch on the critter munch.
  - 6.Draw a picture of your favorite animal eating.
