

Washington Ag in the Classroom Highlights

Ag Literacy Project: We were looking to expand our Ag Literacy program and this year we teamed up with FFA Chapters across the state. We supplied the book Who Grew My Soup, a lesson plan, a reinforcement activity, and the supplies needed to conduct the lesson. FFA leadership students were able to take this lesson and book to 2nd grade classrooms at their school and leave a copy of the book with the class! We had a positive response, and classrooms also received a copy of these Food/Farm Connection Cards to identify where their food comes from!









Our Ag @ School magazine (targeted at 4th graders) continues to be our primary project. Each school year, three FREE issues are mailed to teachers who request subscriptions for their students. The issues focus on a general overview of agriculture, technology, and stewardship; they are supplemented with a teacher's guide aligned to the Washington State Learning Standards. We mailed approximately 12,500 copies of Ag @ School to 305 teachers across

Washington State in the fall, winter and also in the spring.

We have attended Farm Fairs around the state to teach lessons about agriculture and provide ag literacy curriculum.



We continue to promote Journey 2050, which is an on-line agriculture experience for students to meet the challenge of sustainably feeding the growing world population. This is a program for educators and targeted for grades 7-12th and more information is available on our website.
